

News from Az. Solar Energy Association

Monday, SRP initiated the public process for their upcoming Sustainable Portfolio. While significant in money allocated, the program has several downsides, including: a very limited "in-house" solar program that focuses on education, not generation, no reference to a customer-oriented rebate program (similar to those offered by APS & TEP), very little effort on supporting in-state procurement and development of Renewable Energy Resources and finally, an huge expenditure on the M-Power program when compared to other "Energy Efficiency" programs and measures included in the program.
